Bondoukou Clay Pot

**Clay pots** are on our minds. To demonstrate another way of increasing the production of healing herbs, spices, and other valuable plants in household courtyards, we just decorated our veranda with ten locally made pots. Similar pots are used in some pagan ceremonies. When we claim them for productive, Godly purposes, it helps a few people adjust their worldview. Today, the clay jars are plain, with only dirt, compost, and gravel inside. However, soon they will be adorned with color,

bursting with plant life and usefulness. No wonder the Scriptures compare our lives to **clay pots** in <u>II Cor. 4:7</u>. We are just <u>earthen vessels</u>—fragile, easily cracked and broken, made for everyday use. BUT that makes the treasure of the Gospel we carry and the presence of Christ in us all the more glorious and evident. Any beautiful and valuable accomplishment clearly reflects the Treasure of God's image burnished within us. What a Savior we worship this Holy Week and every week! Because His body was broken and spilled out (links to song) on the cross, our sins are pardoned and repealed of impact!
